

Freight facilities

The gas works at St. Albans were well established long before the arrival of the railway. Once the railway had been completed they became rail served and remained so until they were closed. The works were demolished in 1975 and the site is now occupied by Sainsburys. A goods shed was also provided at St. Albans together with facilities for livestock. During the First World War a large number of injured horses were transported by train to the station where they were taken to the nearby Army vetinary hospital.

Elsewhere on the line, freight facilities were provided to the many factories alongside, at both North Watford and Garston. Most of these were provided between the two world wars (between 1918 and 1939).

At one time a brickworks existed near Bricket Wood and this was rail served until it closed in the 1920s. The works also had its own internal narrow gauge railway system for moving the bricks to and from the kilns.

Bricket Wood had limited freight facilities but included a cattle pen for moving livestock. A siding was also provided at Park Street.

Park Street (& Frogmore)

Park Street station was rebuilt in the 1890s and was moved to a new site, slightly to the north and adjacent to the Watling Street bridge.

At some stage towards the end of the 19th Century, Park Street station was renamed Park Street & Frogmore.

The station reverted to its former name of Park Street in 1974.

The Grouping

In 1923, most of the main railway companies were grouped into 4 larger companies following the passing of the Railways Act 1922. The London & North Western Railway were grouped with the Midland Railway and others to form the London, Midland & Scottish Railway (The LMS). This company now owned two of the stations in St. Albans and in order to differentiate between the two, in 1924, the main station became City and the station on the line from Watford was renamed St. Albans Abbey.

In 1939 the LMS was the largest private company in the world with:

The LMS also had extensive interests in air services, warehousing, engineering, removals, farming and gas supply. By todays standards, it was a very large company indeed.

Nationalisation

Following the passing of the Railways Act 1947, the four main railway companies were nationalised and passed from private ownership into the public sector. They became part of the British Transport Commission and traded under the name British Railways (BR). In 1965 this name was shortened to British Rail (BR).

I find it amazing that in town where 50% of the shops stand empty, a successful business has been forced to move elsewhere because of the heavy increase in rents proposed by the owners - the local authority!!

Gordon has been a good friend to the club and has allowed us generous discounts on items for many of the projects now taking place. He has beeen an active member over many years and we wish Gordon and Brenda well in their move to the seaside.

The lure of steam and a site on one of the country's premier steam railways is to good an offer to miss - particularly as the rents are far lower than in this part of the world.

Many of us have become use to having a good local model shop. The period from the demise of Rails to the setting up of Gordon's business was bad enough. Now we shall have to go further afield. Fortunately Gordon will be able to offer a good mail order service, but it is not the same as "popping up the road".

Model Shops are now becoming a rare commodity in many towns and cities. I have lamented in the past the loss of well known train suppliers in the immediate area. London, with the closure of Puffers is down to a mere handful of shops, now confined to the outer suburbs rather than high profile sites in the middle.

There are always swapmeets, but I would take a long hard look before I spent serious money on the items on offer, particularly locomotives. The number of repairs which appeared on Monday mornings at St. Mary's Avenue after a swapmeet only had to be seen to be believed!

Toy shops are today noticeable for the lack of model raukway items. Go into large high street toy shop and see what I mean!

Model railways are fast becoming less of a toy and aim for the adult collector. The result is a declining market and I wonder how long it will be before the many model railway magazines seen on display in newsagents command less shelf space.

The loss of Bletchley Railwayana will produce a void, we shall no longer have a place where we can enrole new members, many of whom live locally yet have never heard of MKMRS!

Our loss is Norfolk's gain, I wish Gordon every success with his new business venture - GE Models. Yes - the change of venue means a change of name! You can't have Bletchley Railwayana in Sheringham can you?

All the fun of the fair

Bricket Wood had established itself from the opening of the line as a pleasant place to visit for walking and enjoying the fresh air. By the 1890's, it had become a popular venue for Sunday School and other outings and a considerable number of excursion trains

were operated to cope with the demand.

In 1899, Grays opened a fun fair at Bricket Wood and traffic increased accordingly. In 1904, a minature railway was added to the list of attractions. This had a track gauge of 101/4", which is still popular today in sea-

side towns, theme parks and other attractions. A miniature railway operates in Cassiobury Park, Watford today.

The increase in traffic required construction of an additional platform for use by excursion trains only. This work was completed in August 1913.


