





Another successful year

1996 has been a very busy year for all of us involved in MKMRS. We have during the course of the last 12 months become more established at Bletchley Park and gained more experience in the art of museum operation. Our facilities are constantly being upgraded and improved and there is little doubt that we are one of the busiest and most capable groups operating within the complex.

It is customary in the media at this time to look back and give a weekly blow by blow of what has been done and how we did it. I shall avoid this, except that we have progressed on every layout and we can now offer our visitors more to see than at this time last year. We have done well and now we must move forward.

During 1997, I trust we shall be in a position to complete both the test tracks and the Fenny Stratford N gauge projects to full museum standard. They are nearly there, now we must complete the task. The Verney Junction layout is the next to receive attention and I hope that this will be on view to the public next summer. The intention is to create a viewing gallery at this end with the layout enclosed behind perspex and wood. Associated display panels outlining the station will be displayed alongside and create an impressive display aea. After almost 10 years in storage the layout still works well, testimony to the work of George Barratt and others who helped the project along, although sadlyt George is no longer alive to see the layout restored in its new home.

I still have no idea what the long term future holds for us at Bletchley Park. I do, however, expect that the plans outlined by the Trust to come to fruition. Without the hand of the lottery pointing over the mansion this will take far longer than first envisaged, but I remain optimistic it will happen and we are working towards that end in all that we do at the Park. I am frequently

asked by members what is happening and this is how I reply:

- 1 MKMRS must continue to show its commitment to the project and develop its exxhibits to the standards <u>we</u> have set.
- 2 The longer the Trust occupies the site then the less chance anyone has of turning it into a housing estate!
- 3 How we go about No. 1 will determine if we have the case for additional accommodation to exhibit our O gauge and other projects (such as the proposed Bletchley model) which would enhance the overall exhibits on site in the future. We must move forward with this as our goal.

1996 has been a busy year. I believe 1997 will be even busier.
