



Business as usual

The 'top story' this month has to be the 'difficulties' the Bletchley Park Trust has suffered in the past few weeks. When we moved into our present premises it was made clear by the Chairman that our fate was now inextricably linked with that of the Bletchley Park Museum. I have to admit to initial personal doubts but I have long since been a 'convert'. When I took over as editor of the MKMRS News two years ago, the Chairman specifically requested the members to be kept informed of BP news and events.

I have attended the meetings to which volunteers were invited and can reassure members that nothing has been mentioned that affects the MKMRS directly or indirectly, now or in the foreseeable future.

The 'Lurid' headlines in the press relate only the more 'unfortunate' aspects of the situation at BP today. It is very much 'business as usual' for the groups with planning for events through to the end of next year. It is a measure of the support which BP has gathered and the character of those involved that individuals holding 'opposing views' can sit around a table and not allow those views to affect the groups as a whole.

This is in no small way due to the openness of meetings, each group is specifically requested to speak, individuals have the ability to ask as many questions as you like and report fully on their groups activities. It can be a lengthy process but the initial report by whoever is presiding over the meeting is concise and is followed by a summary of forthcoming events about which those concerned can speak and request assistance. When complete there is plenty of time for individual questions which can lead to an open discussion on any relevant subject.

Mark Cornelius, the groups' representative has also gained much credit for his even handed approach when chairing meetings. He has expressed a wish, as have others, that groups are kept fully informed of the situation with minutes of meetings distributed to *all* volunteers. He also emphasis that the openness and trust shown to volunteers be returned by making sure that harmful rumours are not spread to the press.

The activities of the MKMRS are appreciated by the Bletchley Park Trust in a way many members may not realise and we have many friends within its ranks.

Kitbuilt or modified ready to run locomotive Scratchbuilt rolling stock

Kitbuilt or modified ready to run rolling stock

Kitbuilt or modified ready to run locomotive 2mm or less

Scenic items Any scale

The rules of the competition state:

- 1 No entry shall have previously been entered in a club competition
- 2 The person submitting the entry shall be a fully paid up member at the time of entry

QGM

A QGM was held on the 26th October and the Chairman spoke about a number of issues which appear below. The Treasurer also requested monies owed as treasurers' are apt to do. The main topics were as follows:

Bletchley Park Museum

The MKMRS will continue to fulfil its role within Bletchley Park whatever the outcome of the present 'difficulties'. A meter was installed some time ago, at the club's expense to monitor use of electricity. We may be required to pay a proportion of our fuel bills at some future date and this measure will enable us to record usage and report it if required. It is also felt that the recording of numbers of visitors entering the club rooms at the weekend could be of great value in the future and members were asked to ensure that the everyone was accounted for so the numbers were as accurate as possible.

The Internet

The Chairman and his son Simon have opened a 'web site' and details about the MKMRS and its activities will be 'posted' on it. The address is www. MKMRS. FS. CO. UK and will commence on 15th November, 1999. The use of this technology can be used to great effect and shows we are 'up with the times'.

Mandlebury Central

No offers have been received for the layout to date. The price is £500 or any reasonable offer. It will be mentioned on the MKMRS 'web site' which may attract some offers.

Bletchley

It has been decided to build an N gauge model of Bletchley station as it was during wartime. It was realised sometime ago that an OO gauge model was not feasible due space that would be required. Panning is at a very early stage and important decisions such as how much should be modelled and whether all sidings and points should be 'live' or 'dummy' to reduce cost and construction time.

Heating Policy

It has been decided to formulate a heating policy to ensure that exhibits are kept at a temperature which avoids damage but does not use more power than is necessary. This will appear in the 'Newsletter' as soon as it is complete, probably next month. The size and construction of the club rooms make it difficult to heat adequately during the winter months as many club members will be all too well aware.

The chairman was asked about the possibility of a coach trip next year and this will be looked into.

The subject of advertising to attract new members arose and several suggestions were made.

The members expressed their thanks to all those involved in making the recent barbecue a success.

The meeting ended on an unusual note, that of the fire bell. A fire drill was held and the members filed out in good time, just under two minutes. A few ribald remarks were made when the signing – in book was read out by the Secretary, trying to understand various 'squiggles' but it is a serious matter and members are asked to try to make their signatures legible.

Donations

A number of members have requested that the MKMRS has a 'donation box' for visitors to make donations if they wished. This was discussed thoroughly at the committee meeting before the QGM. Other groups have them and it was thought that this could generate some income. The general feeling was against such a move although the sincerity of the members making the proposal was taken into account.

Permission would have to be sought for such a proposal if it was considered and now would not be an appropriate time to ask.

By inviting the MKMRS into the Bletchley Park Museum site Bletchley Park Trust has saved us many thousands of pounds not to mention the cost of printing of the newsletter and we have 'done our bit' in return.

The Tinplate Room

The 'Tinplate' room is now ready for the 'Tinplate Team', Stan Pennington, Brian Barnes and Mick Clements to move in. Thanks for this must go to Reg Cook, Paul Wakely and Bernard Worden. The sturdy baseboards with hinged flap by the door and cupboards underneath look really impressive.


Club Layouts
